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Why & What of E-Accelerator

Accelerator Defined. An accelerator is something that (1) increases the pace of activities and outcomes and (2) spreads the footprint of desired outcomes.

What are We Trying to Accelerate?

NetWork Kansas' E-Community initiative has a well-defined set of desired outcomes and an engagement process where NetWork Kansas and each E-Community commit to undertaking certain actions that will empower increased business development.

The Accelerators

The following table provides a short description of each of the five accelerators:

Community Coaching	E-Accelerator provides your community with a coach. This coach is dedicated to working with your community to get the most economic development possible from your affiliation with E-Community. The coach can help guide and facilitate your local E team. Additionally, the coach can help you put to work each of the four other accelerators to increase the pace of progress and the impact footprint of your E-Community game plan.	
Opportunity Analysis	pportunity Analysis Successful economic and business development must be rooted in genuine opportunities. E-Accelerator provides you with independent analysis by the national Center for Rural Entrepreneurship of your community's unique development opportunities. Additionally, your community coach can help you ground truth this analysis and craft a refined set of development opportunities providing strategic focus for your E-Community efforts.	
Focusing on the Right Entrepreneurs	Every successful business knows that it must match its products and services with the customers who really want to buy them. The same is true for communities working with area entrepreneurs. E-Accelerator and your community coach can help you map your entrepreneurial talent and target development efforts based on strategic economic development goals.	
Entrepreneur Coaching	It requires investment, but communities that provide entrepreneurial coaching to their targeted businesses can dramatically increase development activity and ensure better matches for financing and other assistance. An entrepreneur coach can help your community increase outreach, visitation, intake and screening and referral to assistance for targeted businesses.
